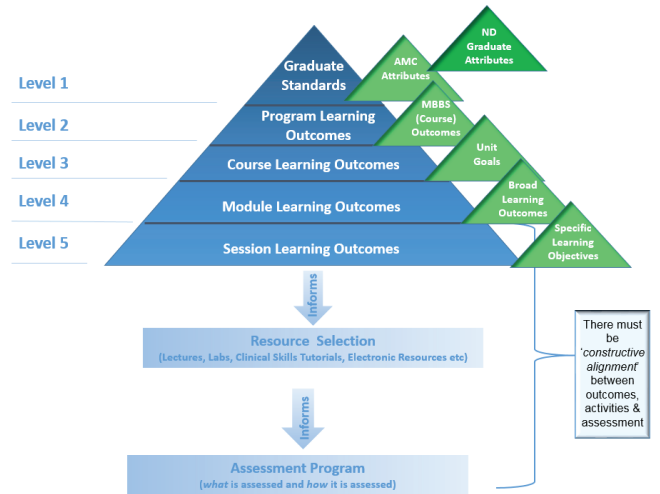


Prudentia™
